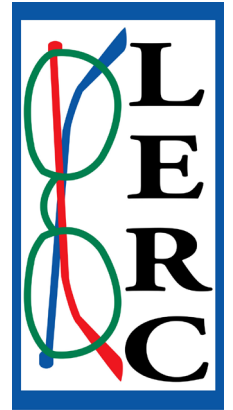

### 1. Summer Volunteer Appreciation Picnic.

Dr. Paul Chung from the Pacific Cataract & Laser Institute (located on Martin Way, Lacey) and his mission team (7 volunteers) were in attendance. They shared their experiences in the distribution of eyeglasses in various countries they visited. Dr. Chung and team enjoyed the time spent with us, they would like to return next year. He and his wife, Iris, made a personal donation in the amount of \$500.00 to NW LERC.

### 2. Mission #384 Vista Missions - Mexico. Carolyn Watson

Larry Watson came to LERC to pick up the boxes of eyeglasses for their upcoming mission. He shared a recent experience at one of the mission their organization completed. Through an interpreter, one of the patients was a truck driver who made deliveries. This was a big-time concern for Larry because the patient didn't have eyeglasses. So, how was he able to drive? He and his brother were sharing the same pair of eyeglasses. That patient was fitted with his own pair of eyeglasses and was so very grateful. Larry said he will never forget that experience.

### 3. A Mission Report was received from PeaceHealth/PazSalud, El Salvador.

In September, the organization fitted 469 individuals with eyeglasses. Darren Streff sends his thanks to all the Lions for their support. These missions would not be impossible without the Lions help. His report of their mission in Cuyultitan, La Paz, El Salvador is attached on pages 4 and 5.

Cuyultitán, La Paz, El Salvador  
September 28, 2024

Through collaboration with international partners and local entities like the federal government of El Salvador, municipal governments, universities, grassroots organizations, and community leaders, PazSalud continues to serve patients living in poverty by providing Optometry and Cataract Screening (OCS) missions to the most vulnerable senior members of society. An OCS mission provides a rare opportunity for economically marginalized patients to receive an eye exam, prescription glasses, reading glasses, eye lubricating drops, cataract and pterygium screening and as needed, a referral for ophthalmological care in the national healthcare system.



### Quick Facts:

**What:** Optometry and Cataract Screening (OCS) mission focusing on optometry services, eye exams, delivering distance and reading glasses, and screening patients for cataracts and pterygia.

**When:** Saturday, September 28, 2024 from 7:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

**Where:** Cuyultitán (town), La Paz (state), El Salvador.

**Who:** PazSalud served economically marginalized seniors living in and around Cuyultitán.

**Team:** PazSalud assembled the following team to carry out the OCS:

1. University of Dr. Andrés Bello (UNAB): UNAB is the largest of the two universities that specialize in optometry in El Salvador.
2. Municipal Government of San Pablo Tacachico
3. Northwest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center (LERC): the LERC donates distance and reading glasses essential to carrying out the PazSalud OCS missions.
4. Wisconsin Lions Foundation (WLF) Eyeglass Recycling Center: the WLF donates distance and reading glasses essential to carrying out the PazSalud OCS missions.

**Stats:**

- 232 low income patients received comprehensive eye exams
- 198 pairs of distance and/or reading eyeglasses prescribed
- 65 patients with cataracts identified and given referrals to Rosales Hospital for possible surgery
- 12 patients with pterygia identified and given referrals to Rosales Hospital for possible surgery
- 51 optometrists from the UNAB

PazSalud (“PeaceHealth” in Spanish) was created in 2000 to share the gifts of the PeaceHealth health system with patients living in poverty in El Salvador. On September 28, 2024 PazSalud conducted its 42<sup>nd</sup> OCS mission providing eye exams and distributing glasses to economically marginalized patients living in Cuyultitán; a rural, agricultural town with a high percentage of low-income seniors. To carry out the mission, PazSalud partnered with international and national organizations, the largest Salvadoran optometry university, and various national and local healthcare entities and local volunteers to combine resources to serve to those who would otherwise be forced to go without optometry care. PazSalud planned and coordinated the event while providing the diagnostic equipment, the supplies, and overall logistics to carry out the mission. The University used the OCS as a teaching and training event for students to get hands-on, practical experience in treating patients, many of whom received eye care for the first time in their lives. The team examined patients, fit them with the necessary glasses, provided them with eye drops to treat common eye dryness, and educated them on self-eye care and the importance of regular exams as they age. All patients were screened for cataracts



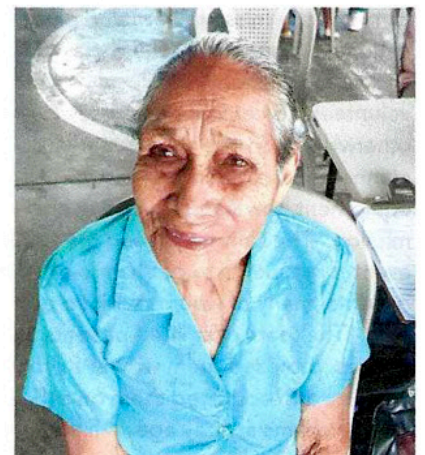
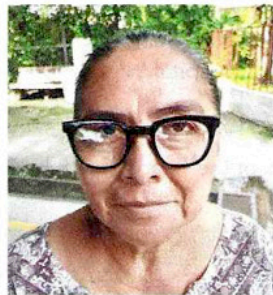
and pterygia and when necessary, given a referral to Rosales National Hospital where they will be examined by an ophthalmologist and evaluated for potential cataract surgery at the hospital.

PazSalud is dedicated to the core principle within our mission of striving to do optometry missions in municipalities where we have never worked before. Cuyultitán is a prime example. Not only had PazSalud never before been to Cuyultitán, but we had never before worked in the state of La Paz. After an initial invite from the town and many subsequent meetings to plan the myriad logistics of a large-scale medical event, we were able to spend the Saturday in Cuyultitán and see 232 impoverished patients of the community. An emotional Hector Escobar, the mayor of Cuyultitán, spoke to our group at the conclusion of the mission and expressed his gratitude for our service saying; 'In the history of our village, never before has any group come to give of themselves to serve our seniors. This is the first medical mission the people of Cuyultitán have ever had, we can't thank you enough, and we hope you will return very soon.'

PeaceHealth/PazSalud provides the funding, the resources, and the commitment for the OCS missions which in turn provides a framework for our international and local partners and volunteers to step in and enthusiastically do the rest in caring for our patients. Each component is essential to realizing these optometry missions and bringing help to areas where eye care is rarely found.

### Patients

An estimated 11% of El Salvador's population is over 60 years of age (720,000 people) and an estimated 40% of these seniors are illiterate (275,000). Approximately 86% of rural El Salvador has no access to any type of eye care. Immigration (voluntary and forced) to the U.S., internal displacement and poverty have eroded El Salvador's traditional familial structure of 3-4 generation households, often leaving the elderly behind to fend for themselves with little or no support network, no earning potential, and few resources. Seniors are often referred to as the 'discarded' and thousands live far below the poverty line, relying on charity to survive.



## Volunteers Needed:

Individual and groups (Lions and non-Lions) are welcome. Volunteers are needed on a daily basis to help process all glasses. Processing glasses includes: sorting, cleaning, and examining lenses for scratches. Further training is available to use the lensometer that reads the prescriptions in the lenses. Training is available and site managers are on hand Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays to assist and train. Please contact LERC before arriving about times and days available.

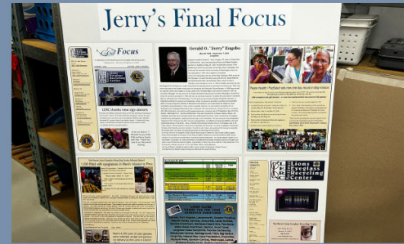
